from January 2018 – December 31, 2023, which provide an update on trends in unit sales of ecigarettes in the United States by product and flavor type. The national brief also lists the 10 top-selling e-cigarette brands, their combined market share, and includes a figure with dollar sales of ecigarettes.

- The Center for Black Health & Equity released several No Menthol Sunday resources including social media posts, posters, and captions.
- A recent fact sheet released by Truth Initiative highlights the increasing interest in quitting among those who smoke. It also discusses various quitting methods, including the effectiveness of digital quit tools like online programs and text message support, while also addressing disparities in quitting rates among different demographics.
- The following announcements are from **FDA**:
  - o FDA's Center for Tobacco Products and NIH's National Institute on Drug Abuse announced the availability of the Wave 7 Restricted-Use File from the Population Assessment of Tobacco and Health Study which contain data collected between January 2022 –April 2023, including questionnaire data, tobacco Universal Product Code data, and state identifier data. Researchers may apply for access to the Restricted-Use Files here.
  - FDA announced the <u>issuance of warning</u> <u>letters to 14 online retailers for selling</u> <u>unauthorized e-cigarette products</u> popular among youth. These warning letters cite the sale of disposable e-cigarette products marketed under popular brand names such as Elf Bar/EB Design, Esco Bars, Funky Republic, Hyde, Kang, Cali Bars, and Lost Mary.

#### **Funding Opportunities**

- FDA announced the <u>issuance of complaints for civil money penalties</u> (CMPs) of approximately \$20,000 (from each retailer) against 20 brick and mortar retailers and two online retailers for the sale of unauthorized e-cigarettes, including Elf Bar, a popular youthappealing brand.

- In <u>a recent article</u>, a pharmacist at the University of Colorado Anschutz Medical Campus discusses nicotine pouches and associated health risks due to their recent gain in popularity.
- The Daily News reported on the results of Operation Vapor Trail, a multi-agency investigation into more than 70 vape shops in Onslow Country, North Carolina.

## **State News**

- Governor Beshear of Kentucky signed into law a bill that requires school districts to adopt specific policies that penalize students for possession of alternative nicotine products, tobacco products, or vapor products and report nicotine-related incidents to the state Department of Education.
- The following announcements are from **Ohio**:
  - Columbus and Cincinnati joined more than a dozen Ohio cities in <u>challenging the</u> <u>state legislature's measure that prohibits</u> <u>them from imposing regulations on</u>

#### **About ASTHO**

The Association of State and Territorial Health Officials is the national nonprofit association representing the state and territorial public health agencies of the United States, the U.S. Territories, and the District of Columbia. ASTHO members, the chief health officials of these jurisdictions, are

- tobacco, saying it violated home rule and would harm Ohioans.
- A judge issued <u>a temporary restraining</u> order allowing bans on the sale of flavored tobacco products to remain in effect in the short term in the 14 Ohio cities.
- The city council of Minneapolis, Minnesota is considering an ordinance to increase the minimum price of a pack of cigarettes to \$15, prohibit discounts and coupons, prohibit the sale of cigars in packages of three or less, and set a minimum price for other tobacco products.
- Colorado Public Radio concluded a year-long series that included 10 articles on tobacco called <u>Hooked</u>: Stories about how Colorado is addicted to nicotine and the money behind tobacco.

# Research

- A Tobacco Control analysis of systematic reviews presenting evidence on ENDS-related health effects identified high-level evidence that ENDS exposes users to toxic substances, increases the risk of respiratory disease, leads to nicotine dependence, causes serious injuries due to explosion or poisoning, increases smoking cessation in clinical trials but not in observational studies, and increases combustible cigarettes initiation.
- A <u>recent article</u> published in *Tobacco* Control concluded an estimate that the US menthol ban would lead to a reduction in littering of 3,777,508,071 cigarettes per year, or 755,502 kg of waste annually if each cigarette butt is estimated to weigh about 0.2g.
