- FDA announced a <u>final rule</u> that raises the minimum age for certain restrictions on tobacco product sales. These requirements are in line with legislation signed in December 2019 that raised the federal minimum age of sale of tobacco products in the United States from 18 to 21 years of age.

### Research

- A Tobacco Control analysis of National
   Vital Statistics System data estimated
   that a nationwide cap on tobacco retailer
   density, implemented in 2016, would have
   resulted in a reduction of 4,275 preterm
   births, 6,096 small-for-gestational-age
   births, 3,483 low birthweight births, 538
   all-cause infant deaths, and 107 SIDS
   deaths in that year.
- A Tobacco Control analysis which merged USA Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System data and National Establishment Time Series data concludes that policies that restrict access to retail tobacco have the potential to reduce smoking prevalence, but pairing such policies with interventions to reduce consumer demand remains important.
- According to a study published in Nicotine & Tobacco Research, the vast majority of Instagram posts by tobacco brand-owned accounts did not follow FDA regulations regarding warning labels, and many included content likely to appeal to young people.
- A study published in the American Journal of Preventive Medicine that analyzed data from the American Nonsmokers Rights' Foundation on indoor smoking

restrictions (ISR) from 1990 to 2021 and indoor vaping restriction (IVR) from 2006 to 2021 found that comprehensive ISR increased for bars (0% to 67.3%), restaurants (0% to 78.2%), and workplaces (0% to 77.5%) while from 2006 to 2021, comprehensive IVR coverage increased for bars (0% to 43.5%), restaurants (0% to 51.5%), and workplaces (0% to 53.2%).
