- o ALA's recent memo provides a framework on coverage considerations for technology-based tobacco cessation treatments. This memo was developed for state tobacco control program staff to continue to improve coverage for tobacco cessation treatment and incorporate health equity considerations.

#### **State News**

- The Public Health Accreditation Board, with funding support and in partnership with Special Olympics International, presents a short case study exploring how the Oregon Health Authority is working to ensure that tobacco cessation resources and assistance are accessible to people with intellectual disabilities.
- A Frontiers in Public Health analysis of a faith-based tobacco prevention network in West Virginia found that its educational and cessation workshops yielded positive outcomes among participants, including increased awareness of tobacco marketing tactics, higher cessation rates, and improved understanding of the health impacts of tobacco.

## Research

A <u>recent analysis</u> published in *Preventive Medicine Reports* found that nearly half of all U.S. states participated in the Smoking Cessation Leadership Center's State Leadership Academy, documenting a strong commitment from participants to increase awareness and improve the provision of cessation services among behavioral health populations.
