This interactive assessment for tobacco control program teams and their partners helps identify organizational strengths and targets to further opportunities for improvements in planning for sustainability.
- The following announcements are from Truth Initiative:
 - o Philip Morris International, the owner of Zyn manufacturer Swedish Match, will invest over \$800 million in new Zyn factories in the United States to meet the growing demand for the flavored nicotine pouches. Truth Initiative shares that health experts have raised concerns about the long-term health risks of these products and their potential appeal to young people.
 - o Truth Initiative highlights that despite established research that on-screen smoking influences young people to use tobacco products, cigarettes remain a popular prop in historical films and TV shows with many failing to show its harmful health impacts.

- In honor of Hispanic American
 Heritage Month (Sept. 15 Oct.
 15), Truth Initiative acknowledges
 the challenges that Hispanic and
 Latino Americans continue to face

- The following announcements are from FDA:
 - o FDA announced that the agency is seeking fines against two brick and mortar retailers and nine online retailers who failed to correct violations after previously being issued warning letters for their sale of unauthorized tobacco products. Accordingly, the agency is now seeking a civil money penalty of \$20,678 from each retailer.
 - o Beginning Sept. 30, retailers must verify with photo identification the age of anyone under the age of 30 who is trying to purchase tobacco products, including ecigarettes. Retailers also may not sell tobacco products via vending machine in facilities where individuals under 21 are present or permitted to enter at any time.

State News

- In a recent WCCO radio interview, Minnesota Commissioner of Health, Dr. Brooke Cunningham, says "Many teens may smoke or vape because they think it helps them relieve stress or anxiety, but the nicotine can actually worsen those feelings. We want teens to know that we understand the mental health challenges they may be facing and how hard it is to quit, and that free help is out there to support them."
- Governor Newsom signed into law SB 1230, which authorizes
 the California Department of Tax and Fee Administration to seize illegal flavored tobacco products discovered during routine tobacco tax inspections. The law will also increase the civil penalties for retailers who sell illegal tobacco products and tobacco products to people under 21 years old.
