- TCN Office Hours Event: Framing Tobacco Disparities and Health Equity

## **Partner Announcements**

- The following announcements are from **CDC**:
  - CDC's Surgeon General's Advisory Committee on Smoking and Health released the latest <u>Surgeon General's Report: Eliminating Tobacco-Related Disease and Death: Addressing</u> <u>Disparities</u>, which reviews the latest scientific evidence on commercial tobacco-related health disparities in the United States.
  - The Leadership and Sustainability School is a nine-month cohort program from late March 2025 through September 2025 that offers a combination of training and networking opportunities grounded in evidence-based practices, promising strategies, and health equity. To apply, please view the <u>application</u>. Program managers or senior staff with at least two years of experience in commercial tobacco control from the following entities are eligible:
    - State health departments, U.S. territories and freely associated states, American Indian/Alaskan Native tribes, and tribal-serving organizations implementing commercial tobacco control strategies, including GHWIC recipients.
    - Communities implementing the Building Capacity to Reduce the Burden of Menthol and Other Flavored Commercial Tobacco Products in Communities that Experience Health Disparities.
    - National Networks Advancing Action in Commercial Tobacco and Cancer-Related Health Equity.
    - Community organizations implementing commercial tobacco control efforts that are funded by their state or municipal program.
- The Center for Black Health & Equity <u>announced the funding of eight community-based</u> <u>organizations</u> as part of a groundbreaking initiative to build capacity for advocacy and address health inequities across Tobacco Nation and beyond.
- A <u>new systematic review</u> by Community Preventive Services Task Force concludes that community interventions involving coalitions or partnerships reduce youth initiation and use of tobacco.

- **Truth Initiative** research published in the *International Journal of Environmental Research and Public Health* finds that more than 86% of e-cigarettes on the market are illegal products.
- The following announcements are from FDA:
  - Following a scientific review, FDA issued a renewal of modified risk granted orders to Swedish Match USA, Inc., for eight General Snus products.
  - FDA posted additional regulatory science policy memos related to the agency's review of premarket applications. This release includes thirteen memos developed between 2020 and 2023 that describe the process and prioritization methods used to conduct filing and review of PMTAs for flavored e-cigarettes and other PMTAs, as well as the bases to support specific actions related to environmental assessments.
- The Center for Rapid Surveillance of Tobacco released an updated report on the e-cigarette brand Geek Bar as a signal of interest, which includes recent data on Geek Bar features, marketing, sales, and use patterns.
- **Rescue Agency**, in partnership with **UCSF** and **Hopelab**, developed <u>Quit the Hit</u>, a social-first intervention hosted on Instagram through coach-led group chats, offering personalized, supportive help to quit vaping.

# **State News**

- Casino Employees Against Smoking Effects and public health advocates <u>held a press conference</u> <u>at the groundbreaking ceremony</u> for Boyd Gaming and the Pamunkey Indian Tribe's new Norfolk, VA, casino, calling on the casino operators to implement a comprehensive smokefree policy.
- Belchertown's Board of Health in Massachusetts is considering an ordinance which would ban the sale of vape or tobacco products to anyone born on or after Jan. 1, 2004, a group that will turn 21 next year.
- Mayor Eric Adams and Acting Corporation Counsel Muriel Goode-Trufant announced that the City of New York filed a federal lawsuit against Price Point Distributors, Inc. for distributing flavored e-cigarettes to retail stores and directly to consumers in New York City and around the country through online sales, violating nearly every applicable federal, New York state, and New York City law governing the sale of such products.
- Navajo Nation (Arizona) President Dr. Buu Nygren signed Legislation 0145-24 into law, amending the Tobacco Products Tax to include electronic smoking devices and nicotine products.

#### News

 CNN reports on a new study, published in <u>JAMA Network Open</u>, which <u>highlights loopholes that</u> allow children to bypass online regulations to buy e-cigarettes.

#### Research

- A *Tobacco Control* analysis of a nationally representative sample of U.S. adults who used commercial tobacco (CT) found that <u>21.3% of US adults who used CT during the 12 months prior</u> to the survey reported receiving more CT discount coupons. Experiencing financial hardship during the pandemic was associated with higher odds of receiving more coupons for all types of CT products.
- A *Tobacco Control* analysis of US Population Assessment on Tobacco and Health Study (2013–2019) data concluded that upon adjusting for sociodemographic variables, <u>respondents who</u> received a cigarette coupon were found to be more likely to initiate established cigarette <u>smoking</u> at follow-up.
- An analysis of 2008–2019 Medical Expenditure Panel Survey linked to the National Health Interview Survey, published in *Tobacco Control*, found that although White adults had higher ever-smoked rates, <u>minority smoking adults had twice as much of their annual medical spending</u> <u>associated with smoking</u> than White smoking adults.
