Funding Opportunities

in U.S. e-cigarette sales has <u>increased by nearly 250% since</u> 2020, with the sharpest increases found in disposable e-cigarettes.

State News

- The Alabama state House passed a bill to lower taxes on heated tobacco products by 50%. The bill now moves to the Senate for consideration.
- A federal judge in lowa granted a
 preliminary injunction to block a law
 to create a vapor products directory
 listing permissible e-cigarette
 products to be sold in the state. A
 group of vaping businesses and
 organizations sued the lowa
 Department of Revenue over their
 law.
- The city of Baltimore, Maryland filed a lawsuit against Phillip Morris International, accusing the company of violating Baltimore's Consumer Protection Ordinance by marketing Zyn to minors. The complaint also says the flavor variations of these products are directly trying to appeal

ODP's Quit & Thrive Challenge will showcase successful and innovative community-derived solutions that have reduced menthol cigarette smoking among populations with disproportionately high rates of menthol cigarette use. These solutions may help inform future federally funded research initiatives or demonstration projects intended to enhance the evidence base of interventions that help individuals quit smoking. By publicly highlighting effective solutions, the Challenge also may encourage broader adoption of best practices to reduce menthol cigarette smoking. Up to

- The Kanawha-Charleston Board of Health in West Virginia voted against an amendment to its clean indoor air regulations that would have permitted casinos in the county to allow indoor cigarette smoking in 10% of the square footage of their establishment.
- A Tobacco Control modeling study
 on minimum floor price (MFP)
 laws in Virginia estimated that for
 every 10% increase in MFP, Virginia
 could prevent 2,232 eighth graders
 and 1,890 12th graders from cigarette
 smoking.
- A Nicotine & Tobacco
 Research study of 25 structured
 interviews with California tobacco
 retailers about the state's flavored
 tobacco products policy identified
 compliance challenges, impacts on
 business, and willingness to comply
 as themes.


- An analysis of e-cigarette sales data published in the American Journal of Preventive Medicine found that between Feb. 2020 and June 2024, monthly nicotine content of those products increased 249.2%, while the unit sales increased 34.7%, a 7.2-fold difference.
- A Tobacco Control analysis of Population Assessment of Tobacco and Health Study data for participants aged 12 to 17 concluded that living in a state with an ecigarette tax policy was associated with <u>lower probabilities of becoming</u> an exclusive e-cigarette user or remaining as one.
