- For states with Medicaid Managed
  Care, requirements exist for
  developing state quality plans. As of
  2024, the state Medicaid program
  must include a mandatory core set of
  measures that health plans report on
  for both children and adults. ASTHO
  developed a memo that highlights the
  Core Set of health care quality
  measures for adults enrolled in
  Medicaid which are mandatory (as of
  2025).

The TCN is a network of tobacco program managers and staff from state and territorial health departments as

availability of tobacco cessation treatments, including counseling and medications, at behavioral health treatment facilities.

- Cancer Society researchers reveals adults using both combustible cigarettes and e-cigarettes experienced the same tobaccorelated nicotine and toxicant exposure compared to using cigarettes alone at the same intensity.
- The Center for Rapid Surveillance of Tobacco (CRST) released a tobacco industry marketing alert that Geek Bar is advertising two new disposable ecigarette lines on their website, including one name likened to LifeSavers® candies, and are available in many kid-friendly flavors. Geek Bar recently advertised a new line of nicotine pouches on social media.
- Results from a 2024 Truth
   Initiative study highlights the large environmental concerns of disposable e-cigarettes, with nearly 53% of young people aged 15-24 who use disposable e-cigarettes reportedly discarding them in the regular trash,

well as Funder's Alliance organizations, and a peer group of the Association of State and Territorial Health Officials (ASTHO) on behalf of the CDC's Office on Smoking and Health.

#### **State News**

- Indiana's legislature included a \$2 increase in cigarette pack taxes and increased taxes on other tobacco products in its recently passed twoyear state budget.
- A bill awaiting senate approval
   in Alabama would raise the legal age
   to purchase tobacco products in the
   state from 18 to 21, establish a state
   retail licensing program, outlaw
   vending machines selling tobacco
   products outside of adult venues, and
   create an e-cigarette awareness
   program for public schools.
- A Nicotine & Tobacco Research article
   examined trends in past 30-day use of
   e-cigarettes and
   cigarettes among Texas college
   students from 2015-2024. Findings
   show that while cigarette use has
   declined over time, there's been
   inconsistent changes in e-cigarette
   use, noting that these changes align
   with the timing of tobacco legislation

## and FDA regulations.

- Alaska now has more people who have quit smoking than people who currently smoke, according to Alaska's Tobacco Prevention and Control Program FY2024 report.
- Attorney General Raoul
   of Illinois announced that \$24 million
   from the 2023 JUUL settlement will be
   used to expand Truth Initiative's Ex
   Program, the Vaping: Know the Truth
   curriculum, and a targeted media
   campaign to reduce nicotine addiction
   and support quitting among Illinois
   youth.

#### News

- An Associated Press article details the CDC programs and initiatives lost due to cuts, including the staff working on the National Youth Tobacco Survey which provided key data on the different products used by young people.
- Thanks to decades of strong public health policies and initiatives, <u>adult</u>

<u>cigarette smoking prevalence has</u> <u>fallen</u> to 11.5%, with some predicting that it will reach a goal of 5% by 2035.

#### Research

- A longitudinal data analysis published in Nicotine & Tobacco
   Research concluded that compared to non-use, exclusive e-cigarette use was associated with increased risk of chronic obstructive pulmonary disease and hypertension among adults aged 30 to 70.
- A Tobacco Control systematic review of heated tobacco products concluded that existing studies do not provide clear evidence of harm or benefit compared to cigarette use, and that longer studies conducted without tobacco industry funding are needed to better determine the health impacts of those products.
- A JAMA randomized clinical trial of 261
  participants aged 16 to 25 concluded
  that adding varenicline to remotely
  delivered behavioral
  support increased e-cigarette
  abstinence compared to just

behavioral support both in the final month of treatment (51% compared to 14%) and at six-month follow-up (28% compared to 7%).

- An analysis of United States sales data published in *Tobacco Control* found that between 2022 and 2024, Geek Bar emerged as a top three e-cigarette brand, and that the proportion of ecigarette sales from FDA authorized products increased only to 13.8% during the study period.
- A Nature analysis of American adult cigarette smoking data from 1971-2020 found that tobacco control efforts focused on young adulthood that address generation-specific challenges present the strongest opportunities to reduce the long-term prevalence of cigarette use.
