- Training & Technical Hub offers free support to states, multi-sector organizations, and communities, centering around upstream social drivers of health to improve both cancer and commercial tobacco related health outcomes among lowincome populations where they live, work, play, learn, worship, and

disproportionately high rates of menthol cigarette use. - The Wisconsin Department of Health Services <u>celebrates the 15th</u> anniversary of the state's <u>smoke-free</u> indoor air law, which took effect on July 5, 2010.
- The Philadelphia city council in **Pennsylvania** passed a bill which will raise the minimum purchase age for electronic smoking devices to 21, mandate ID checks and point-of-sale signage, prohibit out-of-package and self-service sales, implement a tiered penalty structure for violators of up to \$2,000, and allocate 50% of revenue from penalties to fund youth vaping prevention and education initiatives.
- The Rhode Island legislature passed a bill which will limit smoking to one "smoking lounge" in each casino.
 The bill heads to the governor's desk and if signed, will go into effect on January 1, 2027.

- Illinois Governor Pritzker signed into law the state budget, which includes amending the definition of "tobacco products" to include nicotine pouches, lozenges, and gum. The tax rate on the wholesale price of tobacco products also increased from 36% to 45%. This goes into effect on July 1, 2025.
- Maine Governor Mills signed into law the state budget, which includes a provision to raise the cigarette tax by \$1.50 to \$3.50 per pack.

 Reuters released an investigative report revealing how illegal Chinese vapes — those favored by U.S. teens — are smuggled into the United States.

Research

 According to a study published in the American Journal of Public Health, LGBT+ individuals living in states with policies that protect LGBT+ rights had 65% lower odds of current cigarette use and 56% lower odds of current e-cigarette use compared with LGBT+ individuals in states with more restrictive or discriminatory policies.

- A Tobacco Control analysis of 2019– 2023 National Health Interview Survey (NHIS) found that estimates for any disability were significantly higher for adults who currently and formerly smoked compared with those who never smoked.
- An analysis of Population
 Assessment of Tobacco and Health
 Study data published in Nicotine &
 Tobacco Research concluded that
 lower-SES adults ("low SES": less
 than high school diploma/GED and
 annual household income <\$25 000)
 were more likely to report that e cigarettes were very/extremely
 harmful to health and less likely to
 report that e-cigarettes were less
 harmful than cigarettes.
- In a recent Nicotine & Tobacco
 Research analysis, it was found that
 young adults who smoke
 menthol worked (click targets on a
 computer screen to earn cigarette

puffs) harder for menthol versus nonmenthol cigarette puffs, with nonmenthol Hispanic young adults working harder for menthol cigarette puffs versus NH non-White and NH White nonmenthol young adults.

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
