# **Funding Opportunities**

American children from accidental, harmful exposure. From April 1, 2022, to March 31, 2025, the number of reported nicotine pouch exposure cases reported to U.S. Poison Centers steadily increased.

The comment period for FDA's proposed rule to reduce nicotine levels in cigarettes, roll-your-own tobacco, cigars, and pipe tobacco closes on Sept. 15. CDC's web page on this topic gives a high-level overview of the public health rationale for this policy and incorporates evidence from the 2024 U.S. Surgeon General's Report. The Public Health Law Center has an archived webinar on this commenting opportunity and a video on how to submit comments to FDA.

This Notice of Funding Opportunity aims to support new biomedical, behavioral, and social science investigators who are in the early stages of establishing independent careers in tobacco regulatory research. The R03 grant mechanism supports different types of projects, including pilot and feasibility studies; secondary analysis of existing data; small, selfcontained research projects; development of research methodology; and development of new research technology. Applicants are encouraged to conduct projects that ultimately have the potential to inform regulations on tobacco product manufacturing, distribution, and

each receiving up to \$20,000 to support the adoption or implementation of tobacco/nicotine-free policies and provide students, faculty, and staff with resources to quit.

  breaking free from addiction.

According to a recent Bloomberg
 Law article, a federal judge struck
 down the FDA's rules requiring new
 graphic warnings on cigarette
 packages and advertisements, the
 latest setback for a long-running
 government effort to force the
 tobacco industry to more clearly
 communicate the health risks of
 smoking.



# Research

- In an in-person interview published in JNCI Monographs, M. Joycelyn Elders, MD, MS, 15th surgeon general of the United States, shared her perspective on eliminating tobaccorelated disparities and highlighted that educational efforts must be made in a way that people understand and that all people must be involved in eliminating disparities, including the federal government, which can reduce the availability of menthol cigarettes.
- A JAMA Psychiatry analysis of Population Assessment of Tobacco and Health Study data that adults

with a history of substance use disorder were significantly more likely to sustain recovery if they also quit smoking.

- According to a study published in the American Journal of Public Health, LGBT+ individuals living in states with policies that protect LGBT+ rights had 65% lower odds of current cigarette use and 56% lower odds of current e-cigarette use compared with LGBT+ individuals in states with more restrictive or discriminatory policies.
- A JNCI Monograph analysis of Truth
   Longitudinal Cohort data found that
   respondents in areas with flavor plus
   comprehensive smoke-free policy
   reduced tobacco use risk by
   13% and no flavor plus
   comprehensive smoke-free policy by
   8%, compared to those in no flavor
   plus noncomprehensive smoke-free
   policies areas.
