This Notice of Funding Opportunity aims to support new biomedical, behavioral, and social science investigators who are in the early stages of establishing independent careers in tobacco regulatory research. The R03 grant mechanism supports different types of projects, including pilot and feasibility studies; secondary analysis of existing data; small, selfcontained research projects; development of research methodology; and development of new research technology.

American tribes have placed some type of restriction on the sale of flavored tobacco products. 

According to a recent Bloomberg
 Law article, a federal judge struck
 down the FDA's rules requiring new
 graphic warnings on cigarette
 packages and advertisements, the
 latest setback for a long-running
 government effort to force the
 tobacco industry to more clearly

communicate the health risks of smoking.

Research

- A recent Tobacco Control analysis
 found that only one out of 15 young
 adult ever-users of flavored tobacco
 living in Massachusetts believed that
 it would be hard for them to acquire
 flavored tobacco products with
 Massachusetts' policy in place.
- A study among teens and young adults ages 14-25 years published in Pediatrics found that 20.1% of participants were aware of nicotine analogs, while 8.4% reported everusing products made with nicotine analogs. Study participants who reported current use of any tobacco product had higher odds of nicotine analog awareness and ever use compared with participants who had never used tobacco products
- According to a JAMA Network
 Open analysis, nicotine pouch use among teens increased 1.8 to 2.1 fold across lifetime, past-12-month, and past-30-day users while e-cigarette use decreased, resulting in no net change in overall non-tobacco

nicotine use but an increase in dual use of both products. Those who use nicotine pouches more likely to be male, non-Hispanic White, rural, and not college bound.

 Educators continue to grapple with nicotine use in schools, reporting that vaping is "a daily issue" that disrupts learning and poses risks to academic performance, according to a new study from Truth Initiative.
