Action on Smoking and Health published its 2025 US Tobacco Industry Interference Index showing that the United States' global rank has worsened this year. Sample social media content and graphics are available to download and use.

- Public Health Law Center released its latest commentary which examines the tobacco industry's myth that federal law permits the sale of unauthorized tobacco products.
- The Communication Workgroup of the National Partnership on Behavioral Health and Tobacco Use created a ready-to-use PowerPoint slide deck entitled "Behavioral Health and Tobacco Product Use," designed for external presenters to educate audiences on the harms of tobacco, share treatment resources for individuals with behavioral health conditions, and provide key references with credible citations.

As casinos and the American
Gaming Association mark
Responsible Gaming Education
Month, American Nonsmokers'
Rights Foundation is spotlighting a
glaring gap in the industry's

o The Tiburon town council
passed an ordinance
unanimously, enacting a
complete ban on all tobacco
and nicotine products in the
southern Marin County town
— including cigarettes, cigars,
vapes and other e-smoking
devices — as well as

- deliveries of any tobacco goods.
- California's Unflavored
 Tobacco
 List regulations continue to
 be a complication for
 cigarmakers, retailers and
 consumers. Days after the
 October 9 application
 deadline which required
 cigarmakers to register each
 individual cigar they wish to
 sell in the state or risk them
 being deemed illegal —
 questions still remain and
 legal battles continue.
- o The San Diego City Attorney's
 Office reached a settlement
 in its civil enforcement action
 under the Unfair Competition
 Law against Vapor Authority
 Inc. for unlawfully selling
 flavored tobacco products. As
 part of the settlement, Vapor
 Authority has agreed to pay a
 \$100,000 penalty and comply
 with a three-year injunction
 prohibiting the sale of
 flavored tobacco products.
- The San Francisco city
 attorney's office secured a
 roughly \$3 million
 settlement with online
 tobacco retailers it accused

of skirting San Francisco's 2017 flavored tobacco ban through online Zyn sales.

- The following announcements are from Michigan:
 - Detroit's City Council voted to prohibit the use of smokeless products, including nicotine pouches, in the city's professional sports stadiums.
 - Detroit Metropolitan Airport
 is seeking proposals for a bar
 lounge concept with food,
 retail cigars and an enclosed
 cigar smoking area, according
 to the Wayne County Airport
 Authority.
- Voters in Denver, Colorado, upheld the city's ordinance ending the sale of flavored tobacco products, including flavored e-cigarettes, menthol cigarettes and flavored cigars.
- South
 Hadley, Massachusetts passed a nicotine free generation law that prohibits anyone born on or after

January 1, 2005, from purchasing tobacco and nicotine products.

 NPR's Short Wave podcast highlights research showing that <u>quitting later</u> in life can still be beneficial — and could lower the risk of dementia.

Research

- A cross-sectional analysis of
 National Survey on Drug Use and
 Health data and published
 in Nicotine & Tobacco Control found
 that among those who use
 cannabis, price elasticity was
 statistically significant, indicating
 that a 1% increase in cigarette prices
 is associated with a 0.20%, 0.27%,
 and 0.47% decrease in smoking
 participation, smoking intensity and
 overall cigarette demand.
- A Nicotine & Tobacco
 Research analysis which examined
 the interactive effects of sex,
 cigarette smoking status, and
 second-hand smoke exposure on
 COPD prevalence and incidence
 concluded that smoking status
 increased risk of COPD incidence for

both males and females, but to a greater extent for males.
