from retailers — including vape shops, convenience stores and gas stations — that play a key role in the distribution of both legal and illegal products into American communities.

- The National Center of Excellence for Tobacco-Free Recovery and the Vermont Center on Behavior and Health co-authored a Quick Guide, designed to support professionals who prescribe and provide services to people with behavioral health conditions to address dual use, known as regular use of both combustible cigarettes and e-cigarettes.
- North Carolinians for a Tobacco-Free Generation released a podcast episode featuring an interview with Dr. Jessica Young, a pediatrician and preventive medicine physician at UNC Chapel Hill, who shares what she sees in her clinic when it comes to youth vaping, how the products have changed, common misconceptions among parents, and the serious risks to adolescent brain and lung health.

### **State News**

- Santa Cruz
   County, California announced that sales of cigarettes with filters will be prohibited beginning in 2027, now that two cities incorporated in the county passed similar ordinances.
- CADCA released a blog post which highlights a real-world example on how a local coalition used data to successfully pass the region's first

comprehensive smokefree policy in Williamstown, **Kentucky**.

### News

- The Trump administration released a 20-page report, "Make Our Children Healthy Again." NPR subsequently released a news story about the fact that tobacco products and nicotine are not mentioned anywhere in the report.
- In a recent commentary published by Nicotine & Tobacco Research, authors and members of the Society for Research on Nicotine and Tobacco Health Equity Network urge the scientific community and the public to take action to save the science of commercial tobaccorelated health disparities.

## Research

A Nicotine & Tobacco
 Research analysis of National Health
 Interview Survey concluded that
 veterans (7.9% of the sample)

had higher odds of all current and former tobacco outcomes, with the highest adjusted odds ratios for current use of cigars, pipes, polytobacco use, and cigarettes, compared to non-veterans.

- An article published in Tobacco
   Control shares how the tobacco
   industry co-opted Pride Month
   celebrations to promote another
   addictive product to members of the
   community.
- A cross-sectional analysis of
   Population Assessment of Tobacco
   and Health Study data, published
   in Tobacco Control, highlighted that
   the most prevalent tobacco product
   combinations included cigarettes
   and smoked cannabis only among
   older adults, e-cigarettes and
   smoked cannabis only among young
   adults, and e-cigarettes and vaped
   cannabis oils/distillates among
   youth.
- A Nicotine & Tobacco
   Research analysis of key informant
   (KI) interviews conducted with state
   personnel involved in minimum legal
   sales age (MLSA) implementation

from a purposive sample of states, found that <u>KIs reported engaging with</u> model policy components during the implementation process, though states varied in their alignment with the model's recommendations, with areas of more common deviation including penalty structures, whether clerks or retailers were penalized, and required compliance checks.

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
